Every time you write,
remember to include the
following...

Use capital letters at the beginning of a sentence.	A grid of the alphabet from A to Z, with each letter in a different color. The letters are arranged in three rows: ABCDEFGHI, JKL MNOPQR, and STUVWXYZ.
