

PE AND SPORT PREMIUM – Funding to support Primary PE and School Sport

Background

Funding will be allocated to all maintained and state-funded schools with primary phase pupils, including: primary, middle, special and non-maintained special schools, academies and pupil referral units. Elmbridge Primary School will receive approximately £22,300 annually in the academic year of 2024/25.

Impact of academic year 2023/24

- Children have continued to enjoy the opening of the wellbeing cabin and it is used for a number of interventions and pastoral sessions.
- Following the repairs to the trim trail and running track, children have been able to access both resources before, during and after school. Children enjoy the newly introduced clamber stack. All age ranges have benefitted from an increased amount of time to be physically active during the school day.
- EYFS staff and children have given positive feedback about the Get Set For Education PE Scheme and will continue to use it this academic year. EYFS children are enjoying their outdoor area now repairs are complete.
- A full range of extra-curricular active clubs on offer for the whole school, both during and after the school day to cater for all children, especially less active. Participation levels show an increase in physical activity during the school day.
- We have continued to be a part of the Gloucester School Sports Partnership which includes CPD, competitive and inclusive sports events and networking. We actively promote this due to being a host school. Children are monitored to help ensure all children have the opportunity to attend a festival or competition. A wider range of children have taken part in inter school events throughout the year. We hope this will be further increased next academic year.
- An increase in intra school festivals has enabled less confident children to experience competition in a safe environment.
- Actively promoting Five Ways to Wellbeing and children using playground markings. This has ensured every child can be active during school playtimes.
